


### **Appreciating Our Differences**

## NATIONAL HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH

National Hispanic Heritage Month recognizes the contributions of Hispanic American champions who have inspired others to achieve success. It celebrates the histories, cultures, and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Central and South America. The observation began in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week, being expanded in 1988 by President Ronald Regan.

## International Literacy Day September 8th



First celebrated in 1967, it began as an initiative to remind everyone about the importance of literacy to ensure dignity and human rights. A more literate society leads toward a more sustainable society.

Each year, Americans celebrate to commemorate the formation and signing of the United States Constitution in 1787. It is a time to recognize all who have become citizens, whether by coming of age or through naturalization.

During this time, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services encourages Americans to reflect on the rights and responsibilities of citizenship and what it means to be a United States citizen.

Labor Day is a United States federal holiday observed annually on the first Monday of September. Attempting to ease tensions between businesses and striking workers across the country, President Grover Cleveland signed the holiday into law on June 28th. 1894.

Now, Labor Day celebrates the progress made by the American labor movement and the contributions of laborers to the development and achievements of the United States.
